

How To Plant Passionfruit And Tamarillos

Just like other crops, the farmer must make sure that the soil is high in organic matter with a pH 5.5-6.0 and they should be grown away from strong wind and frost. Similarly, prune back the passion fruits every year to produce new shoots and also apply fertilizer and rock dust on plants after planting and water to prevent from the diseases. Because passion fruits flower and fruit in the first year and last for 5 years, pull them out and plant new crops after 5 years and protect from strong winds and frost.

Furthermore for tamarillos, they like to be planted in 3 plants in same area and also should be tied on each other to provide support and at 1 metre height of growth, chop off terminal buds to produce branches and form canopy. Apply compost on top after planting.

As tamarillos are in tomato family and don't need staking, add high nitrogen fertilizer and rock dust, sprinkle good polymix around plant and finally water the plants after application.
