

# How To Root And Grow Rosemary From Cuttings

## Rosemary production

First, select the greenest, youngest cuttings first, cut them at required length and place them in fresh soil or use shoots of at least 6 inches long, remove half of leaves from bottom of the stem and put in water of temperature 21-32 degrees centigrade range for successful rooting and provide light.

In 15-20 days, roots start growing and after 2 weeks from the appearance of the first roots, plants are ready for planting. Pre-soak soil 1 hour in pots for easier transition of cuttings and when soil is soft, make a hole in centre and place cuttings in them. Equally, bury the stem up to bottom level of leaves for it to establish in a week to 10 days after planting. Finally, don't water for 2 weeks once soil is pre-soaked prior to planting and 2-3 weeks after planting, give a tag to rooted stem.
